- Opening Remarks – Department Update
- SRO Contract
This is the second renewal of the SRO contract with Enumclaw School District. Currently going through legal and should be on the May 9th City Council Agenda.
- LEMAP Report Summary
Final Report was received and sent out to all members last week. This will be a long process. Creating a spreadsheet to list out all recommendations and track action taken on them. Have already implemented some changes such as updating ordinances, formalizing agreements, align PREA policies, and way we handle record requests.
- Dispatch Staffing Report
We are at minimum staffing to be running 24/7. Have 6 full time dispatchers. Samantha Stottlemire is the supervisor but much more such as budget, communication with other agencies, training. Hard for her to handle all her other duties as well as being on the radio. In the next budget would like to request another dispatch position to get her off the radio and focus on supervising and her other duties.
- Jail Update
Solidified MAT (Medication Assisted Treatment) and MOUD (Medications for Opioid Use Disorder) contract. Will be managed by Valley Cities. Social Services worker in jail to work with inmates to get off of drugs and not back in jail. Huge benefit for our jail and inmates.

- Downtown Event priorities for Patrol Operations: Alcohol and Traffic Safety
Focus on alcohol and traffic safety. People asking about tractors, ATVs ect. will not be allowed. Everything has to be street legal. This is an issue of public safety. No open containers.
- Peer Support Team
Department will be starting a Peer support team. Will include 6 people from patrol, dispatch, and corrections. Will receive training on what this means and looks like. Can recognize if someone needs help beyond their capabilities. Commonly used in officer involved shootings. Talk, make sure they are taking care of themselves. Have a trainer lined up just need to get date.
- Lawsuit Washington State is part of with Opioid Distributors. Discussing settlement funds. Will be broke down in to regions and each region will go for the funds and using them to assist in the opioid crisis.
