MINUTES

COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE (CSC)

- I. CALL TO ORDER: Councilmember Wright called the meeting to order at 5:06pm.

- II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM 1/19/202: Motion to approve by Councilmember Sauvageau, second by Councilmember Koopman, motion passed.

- III. COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS
 - a. Acquisition of 244th property: Discussion was held regarding acquiring the property. Larson indicated that if in favor, Attorney Reynolds would set the terms with the property owner, purchase price of \$65,000. Property to be cleaned up, demo of structure so it is not an eye sore initially. The intent identified in the Park Plan is to develop more parking for Boise Creek and better flow in and out of the park with access on both 469th and 244th. The committee felt this was a good acquisition to help reduce congestion in the parking area during large events and the primary baseball/softball season, and feel strongly about getting the existing structure removed and cleaned up. Koopman noted that the park is a big benefit for the community. Further discussion on access included walking paths to the park from the school. Some paths have been naturally formed, but looking into possible development is an option. Larson relayed that a Park Board member (Kyle Nearhood) suggested turf for the infields to encourage year-round play. The committee was in favor of purchasing the property.

- b. Helmet ordinance: After the death of 13 year-old Barrett in Buckley, the committee discussed a possible helmet ordinance for the City. Larson noted that the state does not have a helmet law in place, but various cities and counties have ordinances. King County does have an ordinance, but it might just pertain to unincorporated King County. Larson will look into this and bring info to the next meeting. Concerns were enforcement, and that it could possibly bring forth some discriminatory implications for those who can't acquire helmets financially. Some other ideas included a possible awareness campaign and helmet drive as alternatives.

IV. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- a. Park Plan: Larson went through the Park Plan with Councilmembers Sauvageau and Koopman to familiarize them with the content and format. They were encouraged to take time to read at their leisure.
- b. Project updates: MacFarland restroom, fitness court, Garrett irrigation, pool fire alarm system: Larson updated the committee that the restroom demo, fitness court grading and concrete would be done in May, and the install of the fitness court in June. Larson is getting estimates on design for new fire alarm system at the pool.

- V. ADJOURNMENT: Motion to adjourn by Councilmember Koopman, second by Wright. Meeting adjourned at 6:04pm.
