# CITY OF ENUMCLAW MISSION STATEMENT

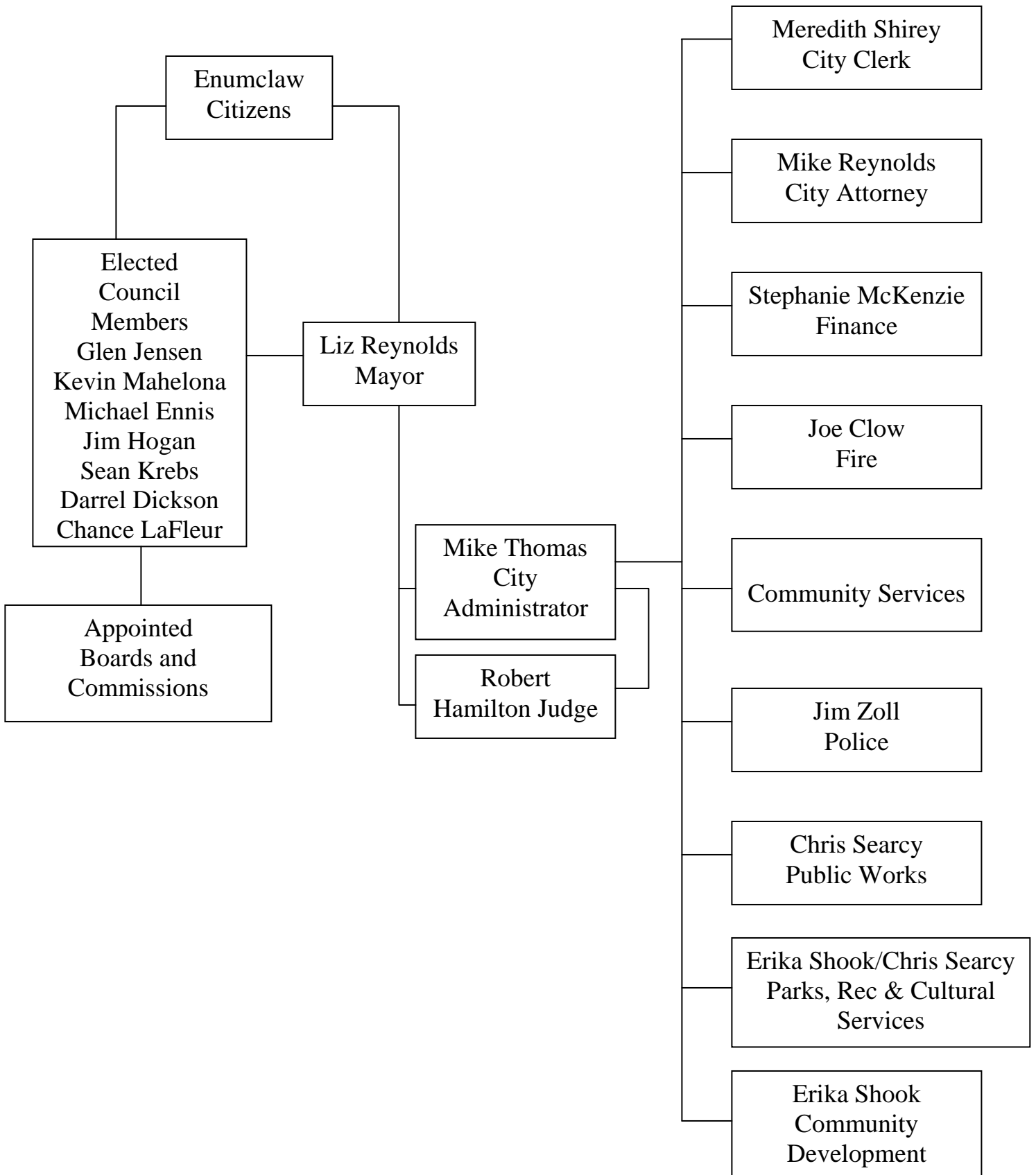
*(Approved 9/12/05 Council Meeting)*

The City of Enumclaw will provide municipal services to our citizens in an effective and responsible manner, preserving the community's well being, respecting the dignity of our citizens and promoting excellence in public service.

## Goals

- A. **Fiscal Strength** - Maximize utilization of financial resources.
  - 1. Coordinate the Comprehensive Plan, budget, capital and long-range planning processes.
  - 2. Prioritize services and projects that benefit the community.
  - 3. Leverage resources with other agencies and private interests.
  - 4. Maintain fiscally responsible fund reserve balances.
  - 5. Provide understandable and timely budget, financial and analytical reports.
- B. **Planning and Environment** - Concentrate development in urban areas and preserve rural neighborhoods.
  - 1. Encourage compatible land use and conservation of resources.
  - 2. Develop and maintain infrastructure that meets both community expectations and development needs.
  - 3. Promote business development with a pedestrian orientation.
  - 4. Develop and maintain a system of attractive and functional parks and street landscaping.
- C. **Community Services** - Enhance quality of life.
  - 1. Support community events and facilities that contribute to the quality of life.
  - 2. Support human services, arts and cultural programs.
  - 3. Provide public safety and emergency services that are effective, efficient and helpful.
  - 4. Encourage citizen involvement through effective communication.
  - 5. Emphasize a customer-service orientation and attitude through all City services.
- D. **Economic Development** – Create environment for successful economic growth.
  - 1. Invigorate tourism and support of local activities.
  - 2. Increase retail sales opportunities that encourage local shopping and dining.
  - 3. Coordinate with King County for efficient utilization of land within the City.
  - 4. Effectively use City owned property for economic development where appropriate.
  - 5. Encourage businesses that provide living wage jobs.

## **BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS**

### **Arts Commission**

In cooperation with private and public organizations, the Arts Commission sponsors or conducts programs to further public awareness of and interest in visual and performing arts. Three-year terms. Meets first Wednesday of each month, 7:00 p.m. at City Hall

### **Cemetery Board**

The Cemetery Board is charged with making all necessary rules and regulations to maintain the cemetery in a manner befitting the solemnity of the Cemetery grounds. Four-year terms. Meets quarterly, 3:00 p.m. at the Cemetery Office.

### **Civil Service Commission**

The Civil Service Commission governs appointments, advancements, demotions, suspensions and discharges of firefighters and police officers. Six-year terms. Meets third Wednesday of each month, 4:00 p.m. at City Hall.

### **Design Review Board**

The Design Review Board reviews and approves building designs, landscaping, and site plans to ensure an aesthetic design. Four-year terms. Meets first and third Thursdays of each month, 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

### **Human Services Advisory Board**

The Human Services Board is an advisory board that identifies and prioritizes the social service needs of the community. Four-year terms. This board meets the fourth Wednesday of each month, 5:00 p.m. at City Hall.

### **Library Board**

The management and control of the Library is vested in the Library Board. Five-year terms. Meets first Tuesday of each month, 7:30 p.m. at the Library.

### **Park Board**

The Park Board provides guidance, direction and recommendations regarding the planning, acquisition, development and operation of park facilities, the community center and recreational programs. Four-year terms. Meets third Thursday of each month, 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

### **Planning Commission**

Empowered by State law, the Planning Commission is a quasi-judicial body and acts as a research and fact-finding group to analyze, research and make recommendations to the City Council regarding the appropriate use and development of land throughout the municipality. Four-year terms. Meets fourth Thursday of each month, 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.
